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Dear Michael

It is really very bad that we have not yet replied to your last letter. I have had a series of deadlines right through the winter and they have been difficult to achieve. Ron Horgan and I have looked over your output, but I have not studied it as closely as I would like to do before I make any statement. The present deadline I am working for should be achieved within a week, but I realise that time is passing rapidly and everything takes longer to do than one would ever expect. Horgan and I have sat down to try to outline what we think the paper should contain. You may well have other ideas. Incidentally, I hope that you have received notification from the Rutherford Laboratory by this time - if not, then I must take it up with them again, but I think you should have received an invitation from them by now.
